Quilt Show Information

In just a few days “Along the Silver Thread” quilt show will be open to the public. Thank you to all for the beautiful entries. It is amazing the excitement the community has for our event. We sold 35 advertisements for the quilt show program. Each vendor we visited was eager to support our event and looked forward to seeing our beautiful quilts at the show. After seeing all the pictures of the entries, I know we are going to have a beautiful show.

Sheralyn Humble handed out your quilt's assigned number(s) and instructions for check-in at the last meeting. If you did not get that information at the meeting, she will be getting that to you. Quilt check-in is between 9-11 am Monday, September 10, at the Creede Baptist Church. If you have some extra tubs that we can place quilts in to store them at the church and transport them to the Community Center, please bring them when you check in your quilt. Make sure your name is prominently located on the tub so we can return it to you.

Remember that all quilts and table runners must have sleeves attached to them for hanging. The large quilts should have a 5” sleeve and the smaller quilts at least a 3” sleeve.

You can start baking now and freezing cookies and brownies to sell at the quilt show. Don Flood will be selling cookies again at the entrance to the show. Cookies will sell for \$1.00 so we ask that you package 2-3 cookies in a bag. You can bring your cookies on Thursday of set-up so we will have them available to sell first thing Friday morning. These were a big hit at the last show.

Beth McFadden will be needing your assistance as a Quilt Angel. This is a great opportunity to visit with our guests about the show and the many quilts/items displayed. If you have not signed up yet, please contact Beth.

Included in the newsletter is the quilt show week schedule. It takes a lot of people to set-up the quilt show. We hope you, your spouse, and anyone else who you know would like to help in setting up the show will be there beginning Tuesday, September 11, at 9 am at the Creede Community Center. If you have a step ladder, pliers, screw drivers, and cordless drills, you may bring them with you. Make sure your name is on everything you bring.

Selling Quilts

Occasionally, there are guests that are interested in purchasing a quilt or item that is displayed. When you check your quilt/item in on Monday, you will be asked if you are willing to sell each individual quilt/item that you are displaying. You may select yes, no, or maybe. You are under no obligation to sell any item you display. This information will be given to the Welcome Desk.

The Welcome Desk will have a list of the quilts/items that are for sale, maybe for sale or not for sale. If a guest is interested in purchasing a quilt/item, they will contact the welcome desk. If the quilt/item they are interested in purchasing is for sale or may be for sale, they will collect the guest's contact information and pass that information on to the quilter. It is then the quilter's responsibility to contact the interested guest, negotiate the price of the quilt/item and complete the transaction. The sale and delivery of the quilt/item is strictly between the quilter and guest. Once the welcome desk has turned the information over to the quilter, the guild is no longer involved in the transaction whatsoever.

We are giving you this information now so you can decide if you would like to sell any of your items. It also gives you an opportunity to research and have a price in mind if someone is interested an item you would sell.

I want to thank each of you for your help in preparation for the “Along the Silver Thread” Quilt Show. It takes each and everyone of you to put on this event. You are a great group of ladies. Looking forward to working with each of you at the show.
