

## **Silver Thread Quilt Guild Creede Meeting Minutes Tuesday, November 15, 2022 10:00 a.m.**

The membership meeting opened at 10:00 a.m. with 6 people in attendance. There was one guest who also became a new member, Mariette Curnutt.

The business meeting was called to order at 10:11 am. A motion to approve the October 2022 meeting minutes was made by Anne Strong with a second from Vi Koch. The October 2022 minutes were approved as written.

There was no report for the general guild account with Beth’s absence. There are no changes to the quilt show accounts.

- b. Community Service – Vi Koch reported that there are 12-15 quilts in process to deliver to Tu Casa sometime in December.
- c. Continuing Education – **December 13, 2022** 10:30 am (second Tuesday) – There will be a potluck for lunch with a Quilter’s Style Strip Poker for the program. Please come prepared with your “hand”. A hand consists of a dozen 2-1/2” X WOF strips of the fabric or fabrics of your choice. It should be fun! **April 2023** – We will make hearts for the quilt show. **May 2023** – Penny Snyder will teach a bucket hat class. **June 2023** – Lynn and Tony Weathers from Alamosa Quilt Company will do the program they had intended to do in June this year. Tony will discuss machine maintenance and Lynn will cover new notions and techniques. **July 2023** – Virginia Robertson returns. Virginia will do a color workshop at the July 18<sup>th</sup> meeting (third Tuesday). She will teach the Broken Carpenter’s Wheel pattern on Wednesday, July 19<sup>th</sup>. There is a 5 color option and a 2 color option for the pattern. The quilt pattern Pat Miller received from Virginia Robertson actually consists of 3 different blocks, Dutch Rose, Carpenter’s Wheel and Fireworks Variation.
