Nancy says she can't pick a favorite quilt technique or quilting specialty because she loves them all! She is an NACQJ Certified Quilt Judge who has judged local, regional, and international quilt shows. She also teaches and lectures on various quilting topics.

Participating members of the Silver Threads Quilt Guild had the option of having their quilts judged by Nancy Fuca. If the entry number of the quilt has a "J" following the number, the entry was judged. The award ribbons were awarded before the quilt show opened on Friday morning. The Viewer's Choice ribbons will be awarded after the close of the show on Saturday evening and displayed on the quilts on Sunday.

Visitors on Friday and Saturday are encouraged to vote for their favorite quilt/item in each of the categories. The Viewer's Choice winning quilts will be displaying their ribbons on Sunday. 





## CHINESE FINGER PUZZLE PATTERN

### MATERIALS:

(1) jelly roll or (40) 2.5" by Width of Fabric (WOF) strips

- 1/2 yard binding fabric
- 3 yards backing fabric

Open your jelly roll and separate your fabric strips. Pick (21) strips to be your background fabrics. These will be your A and B fabric pieces. From each of your background fabric strips, cut (8) 2.5" squares, these are the A pieces, and (4) 4.5" by 2.5" rectangles, these are the B pieces. From the remaining (19) strips, cut as many 2.5" squares as you can from each strip. You should be able to cut (17) 2.5" squares from each strip. These 2.5" squares will be your C and D pieces.

Organize your cut pieces by the block. For each block you will need (4) A: 2.5" by 2.5" pieces, (2) B: 2.5" by 4.5" pieces, (6) C: 2.5" by 2.5" pieces, and (2) D: 2.5" by 2.5" pieces. Use only three fabrics in each block so that the A and B pieces are all from the same fabric, the C pieces are from a second fabric and the D pieces are from a third fabric. You should be able to make about (40) blocks like this. The quilt requires (42) blocks, so for the last two blocks you may need to make scrappier blocks. You will have enough background fabrics (A and B pieces) cut for (42) blocks, but you may need to mix and match fabrics for the C and D pieces on the last two blocks.

To make one block, layout your pieces and sew them together in this order:

$$A - C - B$$
$$C - D - C - A$$
$$A - C - D - C$$
$$B - C - A$$



After sewing the rows together, press all seams toward the C pieces. Sew the rows together and press all of the rows in one direction.

There are many ways to set your blocks. You can set them all the same direction, as we did in our sample. Or you can turn them various ways. Your (42) blocks make a 6 blocks across by 7 blocks down layout. Audition your blocks in various ways and when you are happy with the arrangement, sew them together.

Layer your pieced top with batting and backing fabric. Quilt as desired. Bind and enjoy!



## ANTIQUE QUILTS DISPLAY & TURNING

Quilt making has been common in the United States since the late 17th and early 18th century. The colonial quilts were decorative items that displayed the needlework capabilities of the maker. Only a few wealthy ladies had the time to make these works of art. After 1840, the use of piecework and blocks became much more common. Many of these quilts used printed cotton, pieces of worn clothing, or other pieces of fabric available to the quilter.

Many people have treasured quilts that have been passed down through the years from family member to family member. Others have found antique quilts at thrift shops, garage sales, and estate sales.

We will be having bed turnings of the antique quilts that members and friends of members have shared with us for this show. *Bed turnings will be at 11 am and 2 pm on Friday and Saturday in the cave.*
